LOWRY CAVE PRESERVE ACQUISITION




The Indiana Karst Conservancy has recently acquired the scenic entrance to Lowry Cave and 6.66 acres in Jennings County. The new preserve is all wooded and contains a multitude of interesting karst features, a fifteen foot high waterfall, and 800 feet of steep bluffs overlooking Graham Creek. Several rare invertebrates are also known from this 2000-foot long cave. This is the IKC's first property in the southeastern karst region of Indiana and will provide new and different recreational and educational opportunities to further the IKC's mission.
